ART COMPETITION GUIDELINES

Eligibility

Any Rocklin student (charter, home or traditional school) or resident in Kindergarten through 12th grade may submit *only one entry*

Age Categories

Winners will be chosen from each of the following age categories

- K – 3rd
- 4th – 6th
- 7th – 8th
- 9th – 12th

Judging and Winners

- A panel of judges will review entries by grade level
- 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place winners will be chosen from each age category. Winners will be notified by phone the week of April 1st

*There will be a reception for the winners
Wednesday, April 11th from 5:30 – 7:30 at the Rocklin Police Department*

- Winners will receive
 - Artwork will be displayed locally, possibly on street banners or on city-owned utility boxes
 - 1 free pass to Rocklin Adventures at Quarry Park
- The first 500 entries will have their artwork featured on the City of Rocklin website

Artwork Theme

The theme for the art contest is: *Then and Now*. Student entries to depict scenes representing Rocklin's past, present and future. Some ideas include but are not limited to: St. Mary's Chapel, Central Pacific Rocklin Roundhouse, Finnish Temperance Society, the Racetrack, the fire in 1893, etc. Artwork can be realistic or abstract.

Media and Technique Requirements

- Entries are limited to 2 dimensional artwork only. No sculptures, ceramics, etc.
- Artwork should be no larger than 16" x 20"
- Any of the following techniques may be used:
 - Paint (watercolor, acrylic, etc.)
 - Drawing materials (pencil, charcoal, colored chalk, pastels, oil pastels, colored pencils, markers, etc.)
 - Collage materials (cut and glued papers, such as construction paper, tissue paper, decoupage, etc.)
 - Original digital illustration
 - Photography
 - Artwork should be backed to minimize rips, tears, creases or any other damage
 - **Please include your name, grade level and contact phone number on the back of your finished artwork**

Judging Criteria

A selection committee will review artwork submissions based on the following criteria:

- Interpretation of the theme
- Originality
- Overall design and use of medium

Copyright Law

Any artwork that depicts copyrighted images will be rejected. For example, no artworks depicting characters from television shows, movies, video games, or books will be accepted. All artworks must be original ideas and created entirely by the student. The City of Rocklin has the sole discretion to accept or reject any design. Once submitted, artwork is the sole property of the City of Rocklin, artwork will not be returned to the artist. The artist acknowledges if the displayed artwork is vandalized, damaged or otherwise modified, it is the City of Rocklin's discretion to make, or have made, repairs, or possibly to remove or take down the piece.

Multiple Entries

One entry per student will be accepted.

Deadline for Entries

Deadline for entries will be Friday, March 30th at 6 o'clock pm. Entries submitted after the deadline will not be accepted.
